

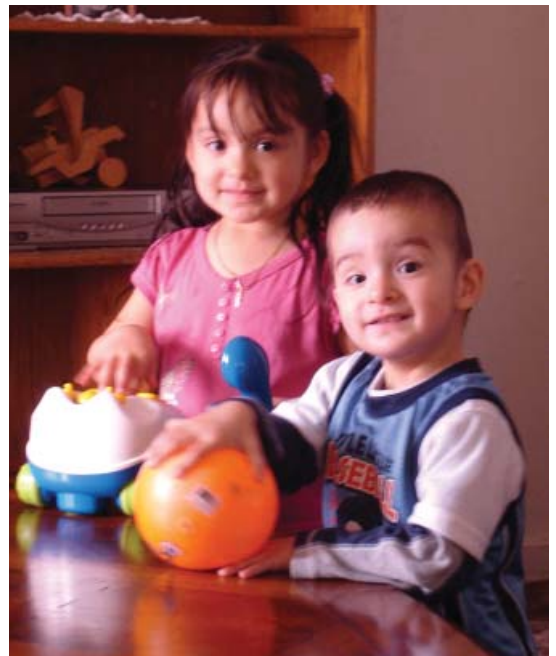

Community-Based Mentoring

A Community-based mentor typically spends time with a child three to four times each month. A mentor gets to choose the child they spend time with and are encouraged to share interests and hobbies with that child. A mentor's energy and friendship will brighten the life and future of a child in need.

School-Based Mentoring

A School-based mentor meets with a child once a week at the child's school during lunch or at the end of the school day. A mentor can help with school work, play games or just listen to things going on in the child's life. This little bit of time makes a huge difference to a child.

Population Served:

Big Brothers Big Sisters targets the children who need us most, including those living in single parent homes, growing up in poverty and coping with parental incarceration. These children may come from all over Sedgwick County and various economical situations. We offer mentoring programs that pair children, ages 5 through 17, with adult role models in one-to-one relationships. Big Brothers Big Sisters want to help boys and girls achieve their full potential through long-term, personal relationships with a caring adult mentor.

Services Provided: **Child Start can help parents determine if they might qualify for assistance with child care, preschool and other early childhood development services. The front page of www.childstart.org has a handy button called “Financial Aid.”**

The Call Center provides parents with a listing that includes where licensed child care is available, how to make it more affordable and how to recognize quality.

Early Head Start provides income-eligible families weekly home visits to promote child development, self-sufficiency and needed referrals.

Kansas Early Head Start provides monthly home visits and child care for income-eligible families who work or go to school fulltime.

Head Start provides full-day or part-day preschool, ensures a medical home, and conducts developmental screening and other services for three and four-year-old children in poverty.

Population Served:

Child Start serves families with young children (especially aged 0-5). The Head Start 0-5 program is for parents, pregnant and parenting teens and their children from birth to kindergarten entry. Families who receive Head Start 0-5 services fall under 130% of the federal poverty guidelines. The Head Start 0-5 program also provides services for children 0-5 with disabilities.
